Now I want to make clear for you, brothers and sisters, the gospel...1 Corinthians 15:1a.

Have you ever wished for a clear and concise articulation of the Gospel? What if someone were to stop you on the sidewalk and say, "Could you tell me what the Gospel is?" How would you do it?

There are numerous passages we could look to, but the one that I am always drawn to is found in 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. For brevity's sake, one could focus on verses 3 and 4. *For I passed onto you as the most important what I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures...*

Here are the key parts of the Gospel to remember. First, man has a sin problem. We have all sinned and this sin separates us from God. Therefore, verse three reminds us that Jesus died to pay

for sins as the Bible told us. Next, it is important to know that Jesus truly died and was buried. Finally, Jesus didn't stay dead. He was resurrected! He rose from the dead. These actions of Jesus made it possible that those who turn away from their sin and place their faith in Jesus could be forgiven and become a part of God's forever family.

Do you know someone who needs this message today? Why don't you get in touch with them and share it with them today.


farm share at fellowship april 27

Farm Share's mission is to alleviate hunger and malnutrition by recovering and distributing fresh and nutritious food to those who need it most through soup kitchens, individuals, homeless shelters, churches, and other organizations feeding the hungry in Florida—free of charge. This makes Farm Share more reliant on community support. If you do not help, they cannot help. For just a few hours of your time, you can be a part of this ministry.

There are lots of ways for **you** to help! If you can put vegetables or staples in a bag, sort items, and pass them out, you are needed. From the FBCH/One More Child: Because of your help, daily we are serving hungry children, foster children, trafficked children, single moms, and struggling families locally and globally. Because of your generosity of time, prayers and resources, along with our expertise in child welfare, 2018 was the most pivotal year in our history of serving vulnerable children with the healing love of Christ! **Thank you for making our work for children possible!**

Here's a snapshot of lives impacted in 2018:

- 249,044 children and individuals impacted
- 7.4 million meals served
- 1,437 children were placed in loving Christian foster homes. **Big news this year:** we began transitioning our remaining group care homes to additional Foster Family Homes to be able to care for more children and to provide the best home environment for children when they are removed from their homes.

Today's offering totaled \$1,842.00! This will purchase 368 full Bibles or 1,535 New Testaments! Praise the Lord! According to Leroy Pfeiffer and David Couch, who counted the offering, this does not include offering envelopes placed in the general offering.

As you know, all of the funds we received go towards the cost to print and ship Scripture worldwide to 199 countries. Gideons and Auxiliary then place them in the hands of those who need to know that Jesus died for them.

We are grateful to your congregation! Thank them on our behalf for their prayer and financial support and their welcoming hospitality. God bless you and your church family.

The Gideons of this area were busy in 2018. Approximately 2,000 New Testaments were handed out to students at Florida A&M; approximately 3,000 New Testaments were handed out to students at FSU; more than 15,000 New Testaments were handed out to students, grades 5 through 12, at the North Florida Fair; and hundreds of Bibles and New Testaments were placed in area hotels, doctor and dentist offices, and the Leon County Jail. 
