If you have been in worship or Bible study in this church the last several months, you have most likely heard the above expression. It is the outworking of what I believe God is calling this church to be in our community. I wanted to share the above scriptures because the heart of this threefold mandate for the church is rooted in those two passages. I believe these verses answer the questions "who are we?" and "what should we do?" in our community. Everything we do should fall into one of these three categories. In fact, the staff and I have begun evaluating our church's events and ministries to see whether they line up with this mission. My prayer is that our committees will do the same. So what do these three statements look like practically? Let's unpack them.

Loving God

This statement begins with our personal relationship with God through Christ. Jesus is the only way to the Father. The category encompasses our personal devotions, scripture memory, prayer, etc., as well as our corporate times of worship, pray-

er, and Bible intake that draw us closer to God.

Loving Others

This category includes our ministry to others. Fellowshipping and living life in context of community is a part of this umbrella as well. Love is the action that most clearly identifies us and sets us apart in this world. Therefore, we are committed to loving others.

Living on Mission

Here we demonstrate our obedience to the Great Commission. We are committed to evangelizing the lost and discipling the saved. Many people understand evangelism and discipleship as separate categories. This is not the case. They are opposite sides of the same coin. We must seek to win the lost, but we must also teach them to follow Christ once they are saved.

My prayer is that we become the embodiment of these ideals. May we forever be a church that "Loves God, Loves Others, and Lives on Mission!"



missions news

The recent training event for the Florida Baptist Disaster Relief (FBDR) was attended by 340+ people. The State Director, Delton Beall, shared that his own home in Panama City was greatly damaged by Hurricane Michael and his family was still not back in it. He and many others were now on the receiving end of a disaster.

The most recent numbers were shared of how much work was done in the Panhandle by FBDR:

- -A total of 6 different command sites were set up to work from
- -1340 volunteers were counted
- -807,532 meals were served
- -Over 800 professions of faith
- -2,560 job requests were recorded—of those, 1708 were by FBDR
- -10,723 volunteer hours
- -35 different state Baptist conventions were involved including Alaska, Hawaii, New Mexico, and Puerto Rico

When you think of stewardship, what comes to mind?

The first assignment God gave the human race is found in Genesis 1:28. That's when God told Adam and Eve to "have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." Stewardship is managing God's blessings God's ways for God's glory.




