## the preacher's point

*"Teacher, which command in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and most important command. The second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets depend on these two commands." Matthew 22:36-40*

*And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20*

For months now, we have closed our services with a reminder of our vision: "Fellowship Baptist Church exists to Love God, Love Others, and Live on Mission." In 2020, we seek to make a fundamental shift that brings us in line with this vision statement. We are seeking to evaluate the way in which we do church and make certain that our decisions, events, and ministries are in the service of this vision. Soon I will be reaching out to our committees and teams to ask them to help pioneer this evaluation process. I wanted to take this opportunity to explain what this looks like moving forward.

As we are planning events, I want us to discipline ourselves to ask, "How does this event fit into our vision?" In other words, is this event a "Love God" event, a "Love Others" event or a "Live on Mission" event? While some events could fall into one or more of these categories, it's helpful to at least ask why we are participating in a particular event.

Let me give you a few examples of what I am talking about. What is a "Love God" event? A "Love God" event is an event that is based in worship or discipleship. Any event that serves to stoke

the fires of our devotion to our Lord falls into this group. A "Love Others" event is rooted in ministry or fellowship. These are acts of service that help us engage others who need to experience Christians who love and care for them. These events can be inward (such as reaching out to widows and widowers in our congregation) or outward (such as serving at a local school or group not affiliated with our church). The last category of events are the "Live on Mission" events. These are events with a specific evangelistic focus. These might include mission projects around our city, nation, or the world. Any activity specifically designed to reach others with the Gospel is properly situated in this genre. It is important to note that some events may actually be cross-branded. A "Love Others" event could also be categorized as a "Live on Mission" event as well.

Obviously, this process will take time, but it will serve to help us focus on the mission God has placed before us here in Tallahassee. I cannot wait to see what God will do in and through a church that "Loves God, Loves Others, and Lives on Mission."






missions news



No matter where you are or what you do, as a Christian, the priority is the gospel. That's why thousands of missionaries across the US and Canada have been sent to share Christ with those who have no hope.

There are 363 million people, 350 languages and more than a dozen religions in North America and over 273 million of these people don't know Jesus. The mission is far from finished.

The week of March 1-8 is the *Week of Prayer for North American Missions* and the *Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions*.

The need for praying is still great. A prayer guide will be available March 1 for your use to pray for the missionaries' leadership, strength, boldness, wisdom, direction, unity; and for doors to open to share the gospel; hearts to be prepared to hear and receive the gospel; and these will find true community in Jesus and the church homes. Will you pray?

The need for giving is still great. 100% of *Annie Armstrong Easter Offering* gifts support thousands of missionaries in church planting and compassion ministry. Will you give?

Your \$5 is bus fare for travel in the local community; \$25 is a meal with an unreached person; \$85 provides subscriptions for training resources; \$100 an anniversary gift for a missionary couple; \$300 provides training and conferences for a church planter's wife; \$500 funds a neighborhood outreach event; \$1,000 gives a missionary family emergency travel assistance; \$1,200 provides Bibles, gospel tracts and discipleship materials; \$1,400 pays the monthly worship facility rent.

The going is still great. More church planting missionaries are needed; more college students are needed to serve through GenSend, a summer-long program where college students work alongside a church plant or in a compassion ministry; more church leaders are needed to develop disciples and multiple small groups. Will you go?

Throughout the months of March and April the *Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions* will be received.

**ONE MORE CHILD**

The ministries of Florida Baptist Children's Homes and One More Child (the global arm of FBCH) has as its mission statement: "We exist to change the lives of children and families through Christ-centered services."

FBCH was started in 1904 with a single orphanage of 23 children. Now their ministry has six campuses in Florida and more than 50 locations in North America, Europe, and Africa. There are no longer orphanages with large numbers of children but licensed foster homes on the campuses and scattered throughout our community to provide a loving Christian home for up to five children. The Tallahassee Children's Home currently has 25 foster homes in the Panhandle with 40 children. It also provides a Single Moms program, family support services, and an adoption service.

The One More Child arm brings hope to children in developing nations to provide food, shelter and medical care. Volunteer teams go multiple times a year to the international sites to serve.

FBCH also works with law enforcement in Central Florida and provides a "certified safe house" for child victims of trafficking. They provide a trained staff that offers physical, spiritual and legal help.

I enjoy listening to Dr. David Jeremiah on my way to work. Each January, he teaches on Stewardship. You can't out give God. Jeremiah explains that 15% of everything Jesus teaches in the New Testament is related to money or possessions. When we tithe, we put God first. Church purchasing policies request that several sources be checked to determine the best price. The Stewardship Committee asks for 2-3 three bids on large purchases or projects.


